

This installation in the Museum of Contemporary Art in Sydney in 1998 included 3 pieces. The first, against the back wall is a 'word-fall' where a continual flow of water runs over a dictionary definition of the word 'nature' and small pockets support plants. In the foreground is a series of black and white drawings titled 'The Satellite's Garden' related to the city of Berlin produced between 1990 and 1993. Each drawing is turned into a cone, backlit and sunk into a tilted plane of black rutile. The third piece on the side wall is the original set of renders for the design of the Garden of Australian Dreams at the National Museum of Australian in Canberra, a project Vladimir Sitta and I had just won in association with the architects ARM.
